PCS Major Specifics:

When is the best time to study abroad?

As a PCS major or minor, you can study abroad anytime in your sophomore or junior year, or fall semester of your senior year. We aim to create flexible and dynamic study abroad opportunities for each student. The department will work with individual students to make sure that their plans to study abroad fits appropriately in their plan of study. Begin planning your study abroad experience early!

What courses can I take abroad?

Many GEC and major requirements can be fulfilled through studying abroad. In collaboration with your faculty adviser, you will develop a personalized plan of study based on the program you attend. This individualized approach will help maximize meeting your educational goals while also progressing toward earning your degree.

Do I need to know a foreign language? Almost all of our international partner programs offer extensive coursework in English available to exchange students.

Will I Graduate on Time?

YES! Students receive UNCG credit for classes taken abroad, so there is no need to pro-long graduation.

Can I Afford It?

YES! On semester or year-long exchange programs, students pay regular UNCG tuition and fees. Housing and meal costs are typically equivalent to a semester in residence at UNCG. Any financial aid received at UNCG can be applied to the program costs. In addition, students are eligible to receive travel grants to help offset the costs of airfare. Set up a meeting with an IPC adviser to review options and learn more.
