MST Major Specifics:

When is the best time to study abroad?

Media Studies is a flexible major that offers a lot of options for students who wish to study abroad. Timing may depend on students' interests, prerequisites, course sequencing, and concentrations. Generally, it is recommended that students study abroad sometime between their first semester sophomore year and first semester senior year. To figure out the best time to study, plan ahead and speak with MST and IPC advisors.

What courses should I take abroad vs. at UNCG?

It is encouraged that students take a variety of MST, GEC, and elective courses while studying abroad. The MST department recommends that students focus on taking **theory courses** abroad to broaden their view of global media theory. MST theory courses tend to transfer back as UNCG equivalencies more flexibly, whereas **skills courses** are more structured; thus, it may be more challenging to find equivalent skills courses abroad. Media courses abroad can often also transfer back as MST 300-level electives, and students are encouraged to explore new perspectives and different media-related courses abroad. Related courses may include, for example: digital arts, design, web, art, and communication courses. **Internships** may be available in some programs. Speak with MST and IPC advisors for more information. Students should keep in mind that MST: 271 and MST: 272, which can be taken during the same semester, are prerequisites for more advanced courses, so be sure to plan ahead so you have more flexibility abroad.

Do I need to know a foreign language?

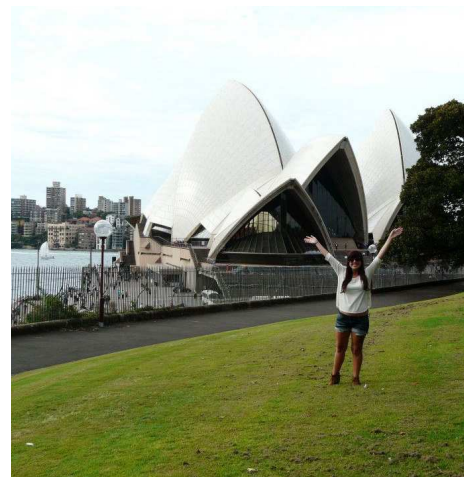
While studying abroad is an ideal time to complete foreign language requirements or learn a new language, most international programs offer extensive coursework in English.

Can I Afford It?

Yes! On semester or year-long exchange programs, students pay regular UNCG tuition and fees. Housing and meal costs are typically equivalent to a semester in residence at UNCG. Any financial aid received at UNCG can be applied to the program costs. In addition, students are eligible to receive travel grants to help offset the costs of airfare.

Other benefits...

Simply studying abroad in any country waives a Global marker, and depending on the program, a Global Non-Western marker.
