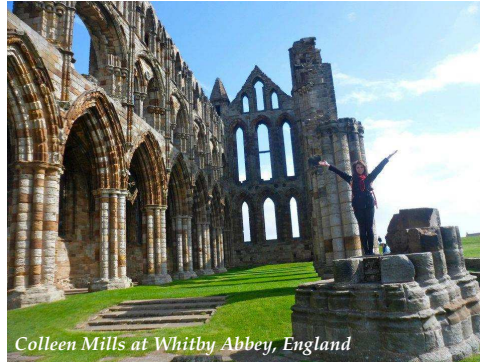

# Sociology Study Abroad

## Sociology Major Specifics

### When is the best time to study abroad?

While every student's situation may vary, students majoring in sociology generally study abroad between their first semester Sophomore year and first semester Senior year. Some things to keep in mind when planning your study abroad experience, however, is course sequencing, certain pre-requisites, and areas of interest. Meet with SOCI advisors to develop a graduation plan that includes studying abroad.

### What courses should I take abroad vs. at UNCG?

The sociology department recommends that students take a variety of both SOCI, GEC, and elective courses while studying abroad. In addition, studying abroad is a great opportunity to take courses on social problems in that culture and other various culture courses. While sociology is a flexible major, students should keep in mind that certain courses may best be taken at UNCG. These courses include SOCI 301 and 302 as well as SOCI 290 and 490. While these can be taken abroad with faculty pre-approval, it may be more challenging to find satisfactory equivalencies. Begin planning your study abroad experience early and graduate on time!

### Do I need to know a foreign language?

While almost all of our international partner programs offer extensive coursework in English, the department highly recommends students consider taking a foreign language and culture course while abroad. This is a great way to fulfill foreign language requirements and will benefit students personally and professionally.

## Will I Graduate on Time?

YES! With a passing grade of at least a C, students receive UNCG credit and equivalent transfer for classes taken abroad, so there is no need to prolong graduation. Transferrable coursework taken abroad can include courses in your major, electives, GECs, and internship experiences. Be sure to speak with IPC and sociology advisors for more information!

## Can I Afford It?

YES! On semester or year-long exchange programs, students pay regular UNCG tuition and fees. Housing and meal costs are typically equivalent to a semester in residence at UNCG. Any financial aid received at UNCG can be applied to the program costs. In addition, students are eligible to receive travel grants to help offset the costs of airfare. Be sure to meet with IPC to discuss your options and go over budget sheets.

## Other Benefits...

Simply studying abroad in any country waives a global marker, and depending on the program, a global non-western marker.
